The Need of the Immoral - Life's Satisfying

John 4

I. A Savior, a sinner, a well, and water

John 4:3-8 He left Judea and went away again into Galilee. ⁴ And He had to pass through Samaria. ⁵ So He came to a city of Samaria called Sychar, near the piece of land that Jacob gave to Joseph his son; ⁶ And Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied from the journey, sat thus by the well; it was about the sixth hour. ⁷ There came a woman of Samaria to draw water. Jesus said to her, Give Me something to drink. ⁸ For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.

Luke 19:10 For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which is lost.

II. "This water" vs. the water that Christ will give

John 4:9-10 The Samaritan woman then said to Him, How is it that You, being a Jew, ask for a drink from me, who am a Samaritan woman? (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) ¹⁰ Jesus answered and said to her, If you knew the gift of God and who it is who says to you, Give Me a drink, you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

John 4:11-14 The woman said to Him, Sir, You have no bucket, and the well is deep; where then do You get this living water? ¹² Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank of it himself, as well as his sons and his cattle? ¹³ Jesus answered and said to her, Everyone who drinks of this water shall thirst again, ¹⁴ But whoever drinks of the water that I will give him shall by no means thirst forever; but the water that I will give him will become in him a fountain of water gushing up into eternal life.

John 7:37-38 Now on the last day, the great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. ³⁸ He who believes into Me, as the Scripture said, out of his innermost being shall flow rivers of living water.

III. The way to take the living water

A. Asking Him

John 4:15 The woman said to Him, Sir, give me this water so that I will not thirst nor come here to draw.

B. Confessing her sins—the "husbands"

John 4:16-18 He said to her, Go, call your husband and come here. ¹⁷ The woman answered and said, I do not have a husband. Jesus said to her, You have well said, I do not have a husband, ¹⁸ For you have had five husbands, and the one you now have is not your husband; this you have said truly.

Isaiah 59:1-2 No, Jehovah's hand is not so short that it cannot save; nor is His ear so heavy that it cannot hear. But your iniquities have become a separation between you and your God, ² And your sins have hidden His face from you so that He does not hear.

1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

C. True worship—contacting God the Spirit with the human spirit

John 4:19-24 The woman said to Him, Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshipped in this mountain, yet you say that in Jerusalem is the place where men must worship. ²¹ Jesus said to her, Woman, believe Me, an hour is coming when neither in this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. ²² You worship that which you do not know; we worship that which we know, for salvation is of the Jews. ²³ But an hour is coming, and it is now, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truthfulness, for the Father also seeks such to worship Him. ²⁴ God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truthfulness.

John 3:6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

Ephesians 2:22 In whom you also are being built together into a dwelling place of God in spirit.

D. Believing that Jesus is the Christ

John 4:25-26 The woman said to Him, I know that Messiah is coming (He who is called Christ); when He comes, He will declare all things to us. ²⁶ Jesus said to her, I, who speak to you, am He.

IV. True satisfaction, a living testimony, and a marvelous harvest

John 4:27-29 And at this point His disciples came, and they marveled that He was speaking with a woman; yet no one said, What are You seeking? or, Why are You speaking with her? ²⁸ Then the woman left her waterpot and went away into the city, and said to the people, ²⁹ Come, see a man who told me all that I have done. Is this not the Christ?...

John 4:31-36 In the meantime, the disciples urged Him, saying, Rabbi, eat. ³² But He said to them, I have food to eat that you do not know about. ³³ The disciples therefore said to one another, Has anyone brought Him anything to eat? ³⁴ Jesus said to them, My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me and to finish His work. ³⁵ Do you not say that there are yet four months and then the harvest comes? Behold, I tell you, Lift up your eyes and look on the fields, for they are already white for harvest. ³⁶ He who reaps receives wages and gathers fruit unto eternal life, in order that he who sows and he who reaps may rejoice together...

John 4:39 And many of the Samaritans from that city believed into Him because of the word of the woman who testified, He told me all that I have done.
